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**Application deadline**

There is **no exact deadline**. However, students must register on our platform after receiving the acceptance message and submit their Learning Agreement **before their mobility starts**.

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## LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

**Recommended language skills**

**No specific language requirements** (except for medical, nursing and veterinary students). However, before starting the mobility the student is strongly advised to have at least

- **basic knowledge of Italian (level A2)** and
- **B1 (Bachelor)/B2 (Master) level of English**

in order to be able to study and make the most of the lectures.

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**Language certificate**

No official language certificate is required.

### Grading system

University of Bologna uses a grading **scale from 1/30 to a maximum of 30/30 cum laude**. The **minimum passing grade is 18/30**.
