Language requirements	The IPCB does not have a specific language requirement but we recommended our incoming students to have at least a B1 level of English. The courses are taught in Portuguese and our incoming students can attend language courses at the School of Education. The teaching staff speaks English and makes sure that the pedagogical needs of the Erasmus/ International students are taken into account. Most of the teachers provide English tutorial support on their classes.										
Grading System	The Polytechnic Institute of Castelo Branco uses the ECTS Grading system. The number of ECTS credits for each course reflects the total number of hours a student is expected to need, in order to complete it (lectures, homework, reading, essays, consultations, seminars, etc.). One credit corresponds to 27 hours of total student workload. 1 full academic year = 60 credits 1 semester = 30 credits

5. VISA INFORMATION

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6. ACCOMMODATION

Mobility participants can stay at the Students' Residences, upon availability.
The IRO service and ESN (Erasmus Student Network) will provide support in finding accommodation.

7. LIVING COSTS

The average monthly costs that students should be prepared to spend is approximately 600-800€:

- Accommodation: 200€
- Food: 250€ (lunch and dinner is available at our canteens for 3.00€/ meal)
- Other expenses (phone, Internet, travelling): 200€

8. INCLUSION AND ACCESSIBILITY
